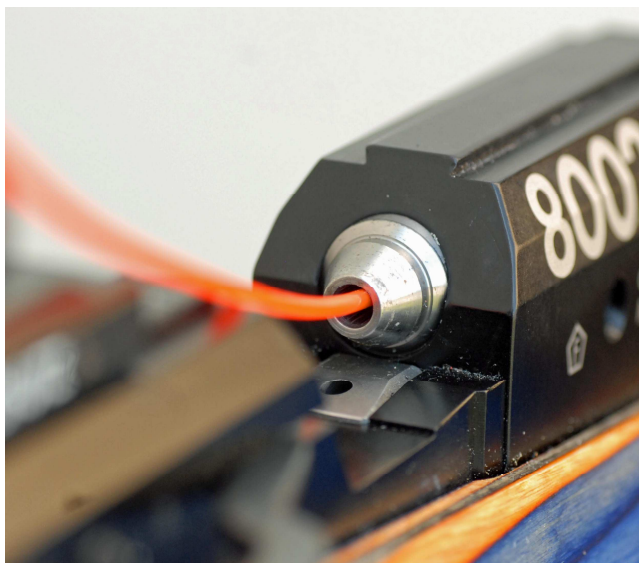
ISSF GENERAL TECHNICAL RULES

- Technical Rules for all disciplines (Rifle, Pistol, Shotgun, RT)
- „6“ in ISSF Rule numbering system
- Includes new Definitions and Abbreviations Section



SAFETY FLAGS

- Safety flagS confirm unloaded guns
- Safety flags required for all guns except break-barrel shotguns
- ISSF design being developed

ELECTRONIC SCORING TARGETS (EST)

- EST standards now in rules (6.3.2)
- All ESTs must be tested before each Championship
 - TD is responsible for EST pre-competition testing
 - Organizer support is required--coordinate testing with TD
- Testing “under normal conditions of use” now required
 - Polytronic 50m ESTs have used belts
- Decimal scoring for 10m Air Rifle & 50m Prone Rifle
 - When 1 point decides a place in the Final among many shooters, too much luck is involved
 - Decimal scoring virtually eliminates luck factor
 - ISSF plans to include decimal scoring on a provisional basis in 2013 World Cups

ISSF DRESS CODE AND JURY VESTS

- ISSF Dress Code
 - Applies to “athletes, coaches and officials”
 - Officials includes OC range, classification and target officers
- Vests for Competition Officials
 - Vests clearly identify working officials on FOP
 - Red vests: ISSF Jury only (available from ISSF)
 - Blue vests: Shotgun Referees only (available from ISSF)
 - Green vests: Optional for Range Officers (not available from ISSF)
 - Vests must be worn while on duty
 - Vests must not be worn when not on duty

RIFLE-PISTOL TIE-BREAKING

- Previous shoot-offs caused scheduling problems
- Inner tens or decimal scoring provide better methods of deciding the 8 best athletes to advance to the Finals
- Tie-breaking shoot-offs to decide Finals positions are eliminated
- Ties will now be broken by inner tens or count-back rules

NEW FEES AND FEE CHANGES

- Replacing lost equipment control cards = EUR 10.00
- Retesting of rifle clothing items = EUR 20.00
- Protest fee: Increased from EUR 25.00 to EUR 50.00
- Appeal fee: Increased from EUR 50.00 to EUR 100.00

FINALS PROTESTS

- Competition Jury: Supervises conduct of Finals, decides rule enforcement, malfunctions and any penalties.
- Score Protests: Score protests regarding the value or number of shots are not permitted in Finals.
- EST Complaints in Finals: A complaint regarding the failure of a target to register a shot may be made. If there is a delay to move a finalist, all finalists must be given additional sighting shots before starting Finals Match shots again.
- Protests in Finals. A Finals Protest Jury consisting of the Chairman or one member of the Jury of Appeal plus two Competition Jury Member shall immediately decide any protests made during Finals. There is a 2-point penalty for protests in Finals that are not upheld.
- Decisions by the Finals Protest Jury may not be appealed.
